**Explore Your Community:** Get outside, be more active, and explore your campus and surrounding areas to see all the natural benefits of living in Northwestern Ontario.




**Turn Out the Lights:** If you are the last person leaving a room turn off the lights before you leave to reduce energy consumption.

All full-time post-secondary students pay the Student Association Membership Fee of \$15 per semester and the Ontario Student Voices Advocacy Fee of \$6 per semester. These fees are administered by SUCCI to provide advocacy and representation to the student body. SUCCI also admininisters a wide variety of other programs and services.

APIWIN (A place to sit) Indigenous Student Centre offers Indigenous students a welcoming space where they can gather, participate in fun activities, find community, and access academic and personal support services. At the heart of APIWIN are our dedicated Indigenous Student Advisors who are committed to supporting students by providing friendly, professional assistance and mentorship during their academic journey.

**COMMUNITY:** The lounge serves as a hub for Indigenous students to build a supportive community by providing a space to meet, socialize, and collaborate.

**ACADEMIC SUPPORT:** Apiwin offers academic resources such as referrals to tutoring services and Academic skill workshops focused on building capacity and supporting academic success.

**CULTURAL CONNECTION:** APIWIN provides a welcoming environment where students can connect with Elders and Knowledge Keepers for both personal support and cultural teachings.



**EVENTS AND WORKSHOPS:** Numerous events are hosted in Apiwin throughout the year such as workshops, quest speakers focused on Indigenous history, perspectives, and current issues which are open to our campus community.

**WELLNESS SUPPORT:** Recognizing the importance of holistic wellness, Negahneewin Student Services provides resources and activities supporting mental, emotional, and physical well-being. These supports include personal counseling services, access to smudging, internal and community referrals and more!

## **2SLGBTQIA+ RESOURCES**

We offer a simple message to everyone who identifies as 2SLGBTQIA+: we see you, we support you, and you belong at our college and in our community. We are a rich and vibrant community because of our sexual gender diversity and other diversities seen and unseen. At Confederation College everyone has a responsibility to create a respectful community that celebrates your unique contributions. Please find below a list of services, supports and opportunties for members of the 2SLGBTQIA+ community and their allies.

#### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

At Confederation College, we are committed to creating a safe learning and working environment for everyone. It is the policy of Confederation College that all members of the College community have a right to an environment that is free of campus violence, this includes homophobic, bi-phobic or transphobic behaviour. All persons reporting these behaviours to the Public Safety department at Confederation College will be treated respectfully and the incidents will be investigated thoroughly. We want all members of the 2SLGBTQIA+community to feel safe, and supported and all members of the Public Safety department are allies in their success at Confederation College.

#### **GENDER INSLUSIVE FACILITIES**

These washrooms and changerooms are safe spaces where anyone, regardless of gender identity or presentation, can use the toilet, wash their hands, change, and check the mirror. Washrooms and change rooms on each campus include signage, indicating the space is inclusive and that Confederation College respects everyone's right to choose the washroom that is appropriate for them.

#### **INCLUSIVE HEALTH SERVICES**

Medical and health services staff are knowledgeable about and sensitive to 2SLGBTQIA+ health concerns and gender affirming care. Referrals to Norwest Health Centre can be provided for those needing gender affirming care.

#### SUCCI WELLNESS CENTRE MINOWAADIIZIWIN

As well as inclusive washrooms and changerooms the SUCCI Wellness Centre features a newly created workout inclusive space for those wishing to use it.

#### PRIDE AT CONFEDERATION COLLEGE

Pride at Confederation College hosts 2SLGBTQIA+ events where students are able to make connections, have fun, and build community on campus. We aim to provide a safer space that is celebratory and supportive for people of all genders and sexual orientations. Learn more about this space and these events as the school year progresses.

#### **RESIDENCE LIFE**

The residence community is a place where human rights are respected and where 2SLGBTQIA+ students and their friends and allies, are welcomed and supported. With 24/7 on-call support as well as in partnership with KEEPMESAFE all residents have access to resources who are able to provide holistic support to students.

The International Education Centre offers a full range of services to International Students, ensuring their time at Confederation College is both successful and enjoyable. 

## UNIVERSAL BUS PASS

The UPass or Universal Bus Pass is an environmentally friendly, cost saving, and safe service which allows unlimited use of the city bus, any time, any day, anywhere that Thunder Bay Transit provides service. Full-Time Fall Intake Post-Secondary Students pay the UPASS fee of \$268 and Winter & Spring Intake Students pay \$185 as part of their student fees at the Thunder Bay Campus. Students can receive unlimited access to any Thunder Bay Transit Bus beginning September 1st, 2024 (Fall Intake) to August 31st, 2025.

If you live outside the area serviced by Thunder Bay Transit, you may choose to opt-out of the UPASS and receive a refund.

The Opt-Out Deadline is:

Fall Intake - Wednesday September 25th, 2024

Winter Intake - Wednesday January 29th, 2025

Spring Intake - Wednesday May 28th, 2025.

#### **HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?**

The UPASS fee is a compulsory ancillary fee that all fulltime post-secondary students at the Thunder Bay Campus pay. Students are assessed this fee at the beginning of their academic term. Students starting in September are assessed the \$268 fee for the full academic year. Students who start in January and May are assessed a fee of \$185.

Your Confederation College student ID card will act as your UPASS. Show the Transit Operator the front of your student card and go anywhere Thunder Bay Transit provides service.
\*If you lose your student card, you have also lost your UPASS. Students can replace a student card for a fee.

#### WHEN CAN I USE THE UPASS?

Students registered in the fall semester can use their UPASS starting September 1, 2024 until August 31, 2025. For students beginning courses in January, the UPASS is valid from January 1 to August 31, 2025 Students starting courses in May, the pass is valid until August 31st.

#### **USE AND ABUSE OF YOUR UPASS**

A student who has paid for the UPASS will receive a student ID (print or digital) which has the UPASS icon on the card. You may ride the bus by showing your student photo ID with the UPASS on it.

A student must use their bus pass in accordance with the following guidelines:

- Students must present their Confederation College Student ID to the Transit Driver upon each boarding with the valid UPASS icon.
- Copies, photos and electronic files of the UPASS will not be accepted. The actual student card must be presented to the driver.
- A student must not make fraudulent use of a UPASS which includes, but is not limited to:
- Allowing either directly or indirectly, another individual to use his or her student card/UPASS regardless of whether or not the individual is a student and entitled to a UPASS
- Altering the student ID or UPASS for the purpose of fraudulent access to the transit services
- Possession or use of an unauthorized Confederation College Student ID/UPASS
- Failing to present their Confederation College Student ID with UPASS to the Transit Driver

#### **HOW DO I OPT-IN TO THE UPASS?**

Campus only.

Visit www.succi.com to find the UPASS application form. HOW SAFE IS TRANSIT? Upon payment of the UPASS Fee, a sticker will be applied to your student card as proof of registration into the UPASS program. Regional programs, students and school board programs are not eligible to opt-in to the UPASS. Only those student groups who pay SUCCI fees are eligible to be considered for the UPASS.

#### **CAN I OPT-OUT AND RECEIVE A REFUND?**

The UPASS is non-refundable. Students who live outside the Thunder Bay Transit service area can request to optout of the UPASS with proof of residency and be issued a refund. Please visit www.succi.com for more information and to Opt-Out of the UPASS.

#### CAN I TAKE MY BIKE ON THE BUS?

Students attending college full-time or part-time in one of Thunder Bay Transit has installed racks on all buses so cyclists can our non-postsecondary programs may qualify to opt-in to take their bikes with them. Bike racks hold two bikes. The racks the UPASS program by paying a fee at the Thunder Bay are designed for easy loading and unloading and are available on a first come, first serve basis.

Security cameras have been installed on every bus. The installation of surveillance cameras is intended to improve the protection and safety of employees and the general public, to reduce and deter incidents of vandalism or criminal activity, and for the protection of property and assets.

#### **NIGHT STOP PROGRAM**

Transit offers a Night Stop program. After dark, you can ask your driver to drop you off between bus stops, closer to your destination. If you feel unsafe, talk to the driver.

Public Transit means you are sharing a trip and sharing space with other passengers. Respect those you are riding with and you can expect their respect in return. Here are some things to remember:

## EARLY ALERT REFERRAL SUPPORTING STUDENTS WHEN THEY NEED IT!

#### WHAT IS AN EARLY ALERT REFERRAL?

- A proactive intervention that helps students overcome barriers to their academic success
- This tool is used by staff and faculty to identify at-risk students and connect them to relevant supports

#### WHY MIGHT I GET AN EARLY ALERT REFERRAL?

- To connect you as a student with supports and services, and engage faculty & staff in assisting
  you to succeed
- Provides support for all students in a coordinated way
- Allows for earlier support before difficulties become overwhelming and impact academic success

#### WHEN MIGHT I RECEIVE AN EARLY ALERT REFERRAL?

#### **ATTENDANCE:**

- If you have never attended a class
- If you have repeated absences
- If you are regularly coming late and / or leaving early
- If you have reduced class participation (disengaged)
- If you are sleeping in class

#### **BEHAVIOUR:**

- If you have marked changes in behaviour, appearance, or emotions
- If you are exhibiting disruptive behaviour
- If your classmates have expressed concern about you
- If you communicate feeling distressed, anxious, etc.

#### **COURSE PERFORMANCE:**

- Missed or failed assignments or exams
- Apparent difficulty concentrating, staying organized, or remembering information
- Poor performance despite student effort
- Declining grades
- Repeated requests for extensions, incompletes, or withdrawals

#### **HOW DOES EARL Y ALERT REFERRAL WORK?**

Faculty and staff who are concerned about a student are encouraged to take the following steps:

- 1: They will Inform you about their concerns and inform you that you plan to make an Early Alert Referral
- 2. They will then complete the Early Alert Referral form on the website. This will go directly to your Student Success Advisor.
- 3. A Student Success Advisor (SSA) will follow up with you. The SSA will then provide the person who made the referral with confirmation of connection with the student. We encourage you to follow up, connect with your SSA and take their advice. This will help you succeed within Confederation College or protect your academic standing for future academic pursuits.

#### **OPT-OUT OF THE PLAN:**

If you currently have coverage on a Health & Dental Plan with either a parent or spouse, you may apply to opt-out.

• Click on the OPT-OUT button and complete the required information; your receipt will arrive in your email, save this! Your Health Plan Fee will be refunded to you via direct deposit into your bank account. Please note name on account must match the students name.

#### ADD ON A FAMILY MEMBER TO THE PLAN:

For an additional fee, you are able to add family (spouse and/or dependents) to the plan.

• Click on the OPT-IN button and complete the family application using a Visa or Mastercard (on-line) or pay with cash in the SUCCI Office. Verify that all of your information is correct: print and save your confirmation number.

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENT HEALTH PLAN

All international students at Confederation College receive health insurance. The cost is covered in your tuition fees and the International Education Centre arranges it for you. Your health coverage is called the "EXPLORE CANADA" plan provided by Study Insured.

### HOW DO I GET ENROLLED INTO THE HEALTH INSURANCE?

Once the semester starts, keep an eye on your college email. After the drop date has passed, you'll get an email with your policy number, an e-card, and all the information you need.

### WHERE CAN I GET THE DETAILS ON WHAT'S COVERED AND HOW TO HANDLE CLAIMS?

Visit www.studyinsured.com/confederationcollege You'll find everything you need to know about the policy, a coverage summary, and even a claim form. Hopefully you also attended our pre-arrival webinar on health insurance, which provided lots of information about the plan, and its attributes.

### WHEN DOES MY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE START AND END?

Your coverage starts after you arrive in Canada, but no sooner than September 1st for fall intake, January 1st for winter intake, and May 1st for summer intake. When you graduate, you're covered for 60 days after your last semester ends, regardless of what date is listed on your e-policy card.

#### **HOW DO I MAKE A CLAIM IF I NEED TO?**

You just need to fill out a claim form and email it to Study Insured. Remember to keep receipts handy though for all medical expenses, as you'll need them to back up your claim.

#### WHAT DO I DO IF I AM SICK?

Before seeking medical assistance, always give Study Insured Assistance a call at 1-866-883-9787. They will guide you accordingly. If it's a real emergency and you can't give them a heads-up, make sure you contact Study Insured within 48 hours of receiving care

#### ARE THE PRE-EXISTING CONDITIONS COVERED?

No, your pre-existing conditions are not covered.

### CAN I OPT OUT ON THE HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN IF I'VE ALREADY GOT COVERAGE?

Unfortunately, no. It is mandatory for all International Students learning in Canada.

#### WHAT ABOUT DENTAL AND VISION CARE?

Yes, for some expenses. For more details check your policy, coverage details on the website or call 1-866-883-9787.

### WHAT IF I NEED MEDICAL HELP WHILE I'M TRAVELLING OUTSIDE OF CANADA?

Make sure you know if your coverage travels with you and how to handle any medical mishaps abroad by calling 1-866-883-9787

#### **CRISIS NAVIGATION**

Confederation College is proud to continue its commitment to student mental health and wellness through Mental Health Crisis Navigator services. Situated in the Student Success Department across from the Hub, the Crisis Navigator is available Monday to Friday, with the ability to respond to all buildings on Campus, as well as the ACE Building and with students at our Satellite/Regional Campuses via telephone/email.

The goal of this role is to work towards a whole-campus approach in effectively managing mental health crises, and to safely connect students with supports available either on campus or in the Community. On-campus Security is vital as they are often the first responders in crisis situations. The Mental Health Crisis Navigator role is tied directly to Security personnel to provide supports to both the student and the people in the immediate environment. 



## COLLEGE EALTH SERVICES

Learning to take care of your own health will be a very important part of your life as a college student. The College Health Centre is here to assist you! Confederation College's Health Services provides primary health and mental health care to on-campus and regional students. Health Services is open throughout the academic year to enable students' access to medical services to help them become active participants in their own health care.

#### WHAT SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE AT THE HEALTH CENTRE:

Regular clinics are offered during the school year, excluding holidays. Medical professionals will provide:

- Primary care of episodic illness and chronic medical conditions; such as Asthma, Diabetes, and Hypertension
- Physicals Annual, 3rd Party, Ministry of Transportation
- Tuberculin Skin Testing and advice with regard to compulsory health requirements for specific programs
- Birth Control, PAP & STI Testing
- Health Counseling Nutrition, Birth Control, Sexuality, Stress Management, Diabetes, etc.

#### **COLLEGE HEALTH CENTRE FEES:**

- 1 Step TB Skin Testing: \$40
- 2 Step TB Skin Testing: \$80
- Mask Fit Testing: \$40
- MTO Physicals (Class F, AZ, and DZ): \$50

#### **HEALTH INSURANCE**

Most medical services are paid by the Ontario Health Insurance Plan. A health card must be presented at each visit. Out of province students should read their insurance policy carefully to determine their coverage while out of province. International students are responsible for obtaining their own medical insurance and determining coverage of services.

## FOOD INSECURITY

Food insecurity exists on a spectrum, ranging from individuals or families worrying about running out of food to outright hunger and malnutrition. It not only impacts physical health but also has profound effects on mental well-being, educational outcomes, and economic stability within communities.

#### THERE ARE FOUR DIMENSIONS TO CONSIDER WHEN THINKING ABOUT FOOD SECURITY:

- 1. Availability: e.g., having enough healthy and preferred foods
- 2. Accessibility: e.g., having the resources to get adequate food in a suitable way
- 3. Utilization: e.g., being able to make use of the nutrients in food (biological), but also knowing how to properly access, prepare/use and store food
- 4. Stability: e.g., having regular and consistent access to adequate food

#### THERE ARE ALSO LEVELS TO THE SEVERITY OF FOOD INSECURITY:

SEVERE FOOD INSECURITY - run out of food and have gone one or more days without eating at times within a year. MODERATE FOOD INSECURITY - access to food is uncertain, insufficient resources to buy enough healthy food, skipping some meals, or food occasionally runs out.

MILD FOOD INSECURITY - experience worry about not having enough food, unable to eat preferred foods, or desired variety of foods.

#### IF YOU ARE EXPERIENCING FOOD INSECURITY, WE CAN HELP

Confederation College has many programs, inititives and events aimed at ending hunger in our college community. These include:

- SUCCI's Healthy Nutrition Program free lunches and breakfasts for students
- Confederation College Community Garden, plots are free for students to grow food.
- Social Events with Food including Welcome Back Lunches, APIWIN Gatherings, Learning Lunches and more.
- Feasts and Cultural Meals open to the whole college community
- Sizzlin' with SUCCI this cooking program offers cooking demonstrations and workshops to help students learn meal preparation skills and create affordable meals. These are often connected to a discounted meal in the cafeteria.
- The Campus Community Food Market provides monthly subsidized fresh produce, increasing availability of healthy food.

There are several food banks in Thunder Bay and the surrounding areas that provide non-perishable food items and seasonal food hampers to those who need them. ## RGENCY STUDENT **FOODBANK**

In partnership, SUCCI and Confederation College operate an emergency food bank for students to access. The Emergency Food Bank is not meant to supplement OSAP or personal budgets but to assist students in the rare times when resources for food are unavailable. This service is non-judgmental and confidential.

You will receive a reply to your college email within 24 hours which will include the locker location in either the Shuniah, McIntyre or Aviation Centre and a code to access your food bag. Please note that we are only able to fill these requests Monday — Friday, requests coming in over the weekend or after hours will be filled on the next business day.

#### WHO CAN ACCESS THE EMERGENCY FOOD BANK?

Current students can access the Emergency Student Food Bank service once per semester. Students will be asked to provide a current student card. Students with greater need are encouraged to inquire about additional support options available through Financial Aid and Counselling Services. Upon access of the Emergency Student Food Bank, a list of other college & community support services will be provided to those students showing greater need than the emergency capacity of the Student Food Bank.

## CAMPUS DENTAL CLINIC

The John Andrews Foundation Dental Clinic provides preventative dental hygiene services to the community of Thunder Bay, students and some staff of Confederation College.

## YOUR STUDENT RIGHTS & RESPONSIBILITIES

Confederation College is committed to maintaining a SAFE and RESPECTFUL campus for everyone. We all share the responsibility to make this campus and community a safe place to visit, work and learn. As a student, you have rights and responsibilities. You have the right to be treated fairly, equitably and with respect and the expectation that you will do the same for others. The following is a brief summary of what you can expect from us and what we expect from you.

#### STUDENTS HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- think, write, speak, learn and pursue social, cultural and other interests subject to the requirement that you respect the rights of others.
- participate in a physical and virtual learning environment that is fair, impartial, safe, and supportive of learning.
- access supports, accommodations and services available to students to assist with academic and personal success.
- be free from discrimination, harassment, bullying, violence and disruption in all college environments.
- receive clear, effective and consistent communication from the college, as well as the highest quality teaching and learning experiences in all programs.
- receive ongoing feedback on academic performance by mid- semester (prior to the drop date) and at semester end.

### STUDENTS HAVE THE RESPONSIBILITY TO ACCEPT THE PROFESSOR'S RIGHT TO:

- manage the classroom, in both physical and virtual environments, including creating guidelines for the use of electronic devices, etc.
- determine subject content, delivery methods and grade assessment.
- formulate and enforce attendance requirements and set reasonable deadlines for assigned work as laid out in the course outline.
- expect that students write tests when scheduled, submit work that is their own and to maintain the upmost in academic integrity.
- expect professional and respectful behaviour in classrooms, virtual classrooms, labs, shops, field placements, internships, etc.

A variety of excellent supports and resources are accessible through your student portal for more information. All of these supports are here to assist you in having a safe and positive experience during your time at Confederation College.

#### STUDENTS HAVE THE RESPONSIBILITY TO:

- behave in a manner which is professional and respectful, and to refrain from bullying, harassment and violence in all forms when dealing with members of the college and community.
- become familiar with college policies, procedures, rules and regulations and to respectfully advocate for yourself when necessary.
- follow classroom and campus guidelines; refraining from communication, behaviour or actions which are unprofessional or harmful to the learning environment.
- demonstrate pride in our campus by treating all areas of the campus and learning environment with respect and refraining from damage, litter, graffiti, etc.
- recognize that we share the space including: respectful use of common and classroom areas, smoking in the designated smoking areas and honouring that we are a fragrance-free learning environment.

## **ACADEMIC INTEGRITY & STUDENT APPEALS**

As a student here at Confederation College you are supported in your academic journey through a series of Academic Policies. When you find yourself navigating conflict or questioning certain decisions that have impacted your academic success, you have the option to turn to the Academic Policies that govern and guide these decisions. One of the important Academic Policies that we maintain here at Confederation College is that of Academic Integrity. As a student, you are responsible for conducting yourself as an honest and independent student.

That means, among other things, that you will not utilize another person's work and present it as your own, you will not copy off of your peers, and you will endeavour to provide proper citations of the material you have utilized to inform your work submissions.

As an academic institution, Confederation College has the responsibility to guide you and support you in upholding Academic Integrity. We do maintain an internal academic integrity tracking module that will stay active throughout your time here as a student. This means that if you are caught in an act of academic dishonesty it will be logged in our system. Repetitive occurrences of academic dishonesty have consequences, including failure of an assignment or test, removal from a course or possibly a program.

If you, as a student do not agree with an academic decision or grade you have the right to initiate the Academic Appeals process within 5 business days of recieving the grade or decision. This is considered the Informal Appeal and there are steps which must be followed. Should resolution fail to be found, under certain circumstances a student may proceed to the Formal Appeal Process. It is also important for you to know that we have a staff person available to help you and guide you through the interpretation and understanding of our academic policies or help you with an appeal of an academic decision that has impacted you. The Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Student Appeals Advisor is available for appointments should you decide you need this support.

## EQUITY, DIVERSITY, INCLUSION, & STUDENT APPEALS: HERE TO HELP!

The Equity Diversity, Inclusion, and Student Appeals Advisor offers a safe, confidential space for you to express concerns or issues you are facing, offering information, insight, and support on several things.

#### THE ADVISOR CAN:

- Support you in the Academic Appeals process if you suspect you have been graded unfairly;
- Clarify relevant policies and procedures of Confederation College:
- Listen to and look into concerns around diversity, equity, and inclusion;
- Help you build skills to deal more effectively and directly with your concerns;
- Offer referral to resources both on and off campus; and
- Give insight into strategies for conflict resolution.

#### THE ADVISOR CANNOT:

- Decide who is right or wrong in situations of conflict, nor take sides;
- Provide legal advice or psychological counselling;
- Overrule or change a decision; or
- Determine or change policy.

#### IT IS NEVER TOO EARLY TO ADDRESS A CONCERN!

Please feel welcome to reach out to the Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Student Appeals Advisor and we will do our best to help you determine potential solutions or support you in finding suitable resources available to you.

#### **FIVE TIPS FOR CONFLICT RESOLUTION:**

- 1. Be prepared. Write down all your questions and concerns. Bring any related documentation with you to meetings.
- 2. Ask questions, particularly those that will help you understand the other person's perspective and their rationale.
- 3. Keep good records and take notes, including names and times of any relevant interactions.
- 4. Try and approach conflict with a positive, solutionfocused mindset.
- 5. Self-reflect and recognize both your own accountability as well as that of others.

## PUBLIC SAFETY CAMPUS SECURITY

Our staff of professionally trained Security Guards are available 24 hours per day to provide you with assistance when you need it. In an emergency (whether internal or external), Security will respond to your location, provide support to you, and they will give exact directions for the emergency responders.

#### THE HELP! PHONE

Look for "Help! Phones" across campus: in all academic buildings and at Sibley Hall Residence. They are your one-stop access point for help!

#### "BLUE BUTTON" URGENT ASSISTANCE

Sometimes an emergency is so urgent (e.g. assault, etc.), that you don't have time to talk. You can still get help, by pressing a "Blue Button" urgent assistance on the wall or an Emergency Pillar on campus.

#### **CAMPUS WALK**

Campus Security is available to escort individuals to their vehicles, or between buildings. Between September and May, walk and check in services are available by the Campus Watch Student Volunteer Program from 4pm to 10pm Mon - Fri. If interested in volunteering please visit the Security Office for more information.

#### **CAMPUS ALONE**

ampus Alone is a "check-in" service for individuals who are working alone on campus after regular hours.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

If you dial 911 from a College phone, an e-mail alert will be sent immediately to the Public Safety — Security Service.

Security's contact information is also listed on the back of your student card.

To request service from Campus Security, visit the Public Safety — Security Office, Shuniah Room 123D, use a Help! Phone, or dial 623-0465 from a cell phone.

Stop by the Security Office located near the West Entrance across from the HUB and beside the elevator if you have questions or issues.





#### HARASSMENT AND VIOLENCE: WE WON'T STAND FOR IT!

All members of the college community have a right to a work and study environment that is free of harassment, violence and the threat of violence.

Break the silence: report incidents of harassment, (including cyberbullying), violence or the threat of violence. Help is available by contacting:

- Your Faculty member, your Program Coordinator or Dean;
- The Counselling Office and Student Success Centre;
- Facility Managers at the Wellness Centre and Residence; or
- Your Campus Director (at regional campuses);
- Your Student Association (SUCCI)
- Using the Safe Campus APP and submitting a report

#### **BUILDING ACCESS (ENTRY PERMITS)**

Campus Security is also responsible for building and room access. Students who need access to a classroom or lab after regular hours, need permission to be in the building.

Submit a signed Entry Permit to the Public Safety - Security Office, Shuniah Room 123D, no later than 4:30 PM, Monday to Friday. #### **EVACUATION ALARM BELLS**

When a fire occurs or smoke is detected, you will hear fire alarms ringing or smoke detectors sounding. When the fire or smoke alarm sounds, you must leave the building immediately by the most direct route to the outdoors. Use the stairs. Do not use elevators. Walk, don't run.

#### **EVACUATION IS NOT ALWAYS THE BEST RESPONSE.**

IN SOME EMERGENCY SITUATIONS, EVACUATION MAY NOT BE A SAFE RESPONSE ALTERNATIVE.

#### SHELTER IN PLACE

The Shelter in Place strategy will be implemented in the case of an external environmental threat in the vicinity of the college, such as a chemical spill or gas leak in neighbourhood or during extreme weather.

- Return indoors / don't go outdoors; close windows & window coverings
- Turn off cell phones & electronic devices; do not call Switchboard, Security, etc. for info
- Continue regular indoor routines; remain in place until advised by public announcement that Shelter in Place has been lifted.

WHEN THINKING ABOUT WHAT YOU NEED TO DO IF A LOCKDOWN WERE ANNOUNCED, REMEMBER THE FOLLOWING:
OUT OF SIGHT. OUT OF MIND.
OUT OF HARM'S WAY.

The Hold and Secure procedure is initiated when the threat is near, but not inside the building, such as when there is an offender in the neighbourhood.

- Return indoors / don't go outdoors; close & lock exterior doors; close windows & window coverings
- Turn off cell phones & electronic devices; do not call Switchboard, Security, etc. for info
- Continue regular indoor routines; remain in place until advised by public announcement that Hold and Secure has been lifted

#### **LOCKDOWN**

The Lockdown procedure is initiated when danger is present on the college site (e.g. active shooter in building), and the safety of students, staff and public is threatened.

- Enter the nearest room; close doors, locking or barricading when possible; close windows & window coverings; move away from doors and windows
- Turn off cell phones & electronic devices; maintain silence; do not call Switchboard, Security, etc. for info; call 911 or contact Security only if you have helpful information (e.g. location of suspect, etc.)
- Lie on floor if gunshots are heard; prepare to evacuate the building or to relocate to another space if your security is compromised; remain in place until advised by the Police

## PUBLIC SAFETY HEALTH & SAFETY

Confederation College is a safe and healthy learning community in which all community members, including you have a role to play. First Aid kits, Band Aid stations, and AEDs are located in strategic locations around the campus to ensure they are accessible if needed in an emergency or emergency situation.

#### REPORTING HAZARDS

To report a hazard in a classroom, lab or shop, advise your faculty member or technologist immediately.

To report a hazard on the grounds (e.g. icy sidewalk, etc.) or in a public place on campus (e.g a spill on a stairway or in a hallway, etc.):

- At the Thunder Bay Campus, contact Facilities Services, by using a "Help! Phone" located in all academic buildings on campus and at Sibley Hall Residence.
- At Regional Campuses, contact the main office for assistance.

#### **REPORTING INJURIES**

At the Thunder Bay Campus: In a life-threatening or unknown medical emergency, dial 911 from a College phone; or call 911 from a cell phone and then contact Public Safety (623-0465).

Use the closest "Help! Phone" (in a classroom or corridor); or, the Emergency Pillars on campus. You can also contact Public Safety by calling 922 from a college phone, or by calling 623-0465 from a cell phone or private phone.

At regional campuses: contact the main office for assistance.



#### **USING SAFETY EQUIPMENT OR CLOTHING**

Activities in some programs require that students use or wear specific types of safety equipment or clothing. Consult with your faculty member or program coordinator for safety requirements in your program.

#### **FOLLOWING SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS**

Working in a lab or shop? Follow the directions of your faculty member or technologist. Their instructions reflect legislated safety requirements and best safe work practices.

#### WE SHARE THE AIR!

Smoking at all campuses is permitted in designated smoking areas only. For the location of the designated smoking area nearest you, refer to the "We Share The Air!". Look for signage indicating areas where smoking is permitted.

- The use of smokeless tobacco, including both snuff and chew, is not permitted within any College building or vehicle.
- The use of e-cigarettes and vaping is restricted to designated smoking areas.
- All Confederation College facilities are "fragrance free".
- Cannabis or Cannabis product use is not permitted on Campus

## SEXUAL VIOLENCE XUAL MISCONDUCT

All members of Confederation College's community have a right to work, learn, live, and express themselves in an environment that is free from any form of sexual violence & sexual misconduct. To this end, we have a policy that sets out the way in which we address sexual violence& sexual misconduct. We ensure that those affected by sexual violence are believed and appropriately accommodated. When an investigation is initiated, the College has a process that protects the rights of all individuals.

Everyone in our community has the responsibility to help maintain a safe and respectful campus for everyone.

#### IF YOU EXPERIENCE SEXUAL VIOLENCE

If you are in danger or need immediate assistance: call 911 for police and paramedic assistance. At the Thunder Bay campus, call 922 from a College phone or 807 623 0465 for Security assistance. At our Regional Campuses, call 911.

#### IF YOU WITNESS SEXUAL VIOLENCE OR MISCONDUCT

If you witness sexual violence, there are steps that you can take to provide immediate assistance to the survivor:

Get them to a safe place, i.e. residence, with a trusted friend/family member, a Residence Advisor, or a Confederation College employee.

If they are in danger or need immediate assistance: call 911 for police and paramedic assistance. At the Thunder Bay campus, call 922 from a College phone or (807) 623-0465 for Security assistance. At our Regional Campuses, call 911.

Assist the survivor to reach out to on and off-campus supports and resources. As a witness to sexual violence or sexual misconduct, you may also wish to access supports and resources for yourself.

#### **NEXT STEPS: ACCESSING SUPPORT OR MAKING A COMPLAINT**

Individuals who have experienced sexual violence or sexual misconduct are under no obligation to file a formal complaint in order to access on-campus supports or resources including accommodations for academics (students), or to be referred to off-campus supports and resources. If allegations are being made against a member of the College community, individuals may file an informal report or a formal complaint that will result in an investigation. All reports/complaints remain confidential, and all efforts will be made to ensure the survivor controls the process.

#### **HOW CONFEDERATION COLLEGE WILL RESPOND**

The College understands that individuals who have experienced sexual violence may wish to control whether and how their experience will be dealt with by the College and/or by the police. In most circumstances, the person will retain this control; however, if the College believes that the safety of other members of the College community are at risk, the College may be required to initiate an internal investigation and/or inform the police, even without the person's consent. In these circumstances, the confidentiality and anonymity of the person(s) affected will be prioritized.

Whenever a complaint of sexual violence has been reported to the College, the College will exercise care to protect and respect the rights of both the complainant and the respondent. A survivor who comes forward to report will be considered truthful. This does not imply that judgement has been rendered against the respondent.

Confederation College is committed to creating awareness, preventing sexual violence and creating a safe space for anyone in our College community who has been affected by sexual violence. The College is expected to be a safe and positive space where members of the College community feel able to work, learn, live and express themselves in an environment free from sexual violence & misconduct. Sexual misconduct and sexual violence are unacceptable and will not be tolerated.


