Admission Requirements

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (or equivalent) with courses from the College (C), University (U), University/College (U/C), or Open (O) preparation levels with Grade 12 English (C/U) Level.
- or successful completion of the Mature Student Assessment.
- or successful completion of the General Education Development Test (GED).
- or appropriate credits from the Academic and Career Entrance program (ACE).
- Applicants must be 18 years of age by the beginning of semester 2 of the Paramedic Program so that they can obtain a Police Vulnerable Sector Check. The Police Vulnerable Sector Check is a requirement for attending any/all hospital and field placements, which is a requirement which begins is semester 2.
- Applicants must have a full-G license by the beginning of semester 3 in order to participate in ambulance operations training which involves emergency vehicle driving on a closed driving course. Additionally, students are required to obtain an F class license by the beginning of semester 4 so that they can apply to work as a paramedic in the Province of Ontario. To be eligible for F-class licensing, the Ministry of Transportation Ontario (MTO) requires that candidate to have an existing full G-license.

Additional Required Courses

- Grade 11 Math (College or University Preparation) &
- Grade 11 or 12 Biology (College or University Preparation) &
- Grade 11 or 12 Chemistry (College or University Preparation)

Minimum final grade of 65% in each required course.

If you are currently enrolled in the required courses, you must have a mid term and final mark of 65% or higher to qualify for selection/admission.

Alternative Pathways

If you do not possess the necessary admission requirements (or equivalency), we encourage you to consider our Pre-Health Sciences-Pathway to Certificates and Diplomas program which will provide the necessary preparation to apply to this program. Completion of the Pre-Health Sciences-Pathway to Certificates and Diplomas program does not guarantee admission to the Paramedic Program in a subsequent year.
