	3.1 City of Thunder Bay Emergency Task Force Update	 Total of 700 cases in the Thunder Bay District since Covid first began. Currently 83 active cases 8 additional cases will be announced today. Still working to get cases at Roseview Manor under control. Majority of cases right now coming from long-term care and the jail centre. Working on details with regards to restrictions, update to come. TBDHU will lead vaccines. Residents of long-term care will be the first to receive vaccinations. TBDHU has developed a plan for the Thunder Bay area. More details to be available next meeting. Color coding framework may change as it's not really being followed. Thunder Bay Health Science Centre, currently 5 cases in the hospital with 3 of those in ICU. These cases are not necessarily from Thunder Bay. Vulnerable population not at capacity yet. Final prep on centres for vulnerable population (eg. a place to go when they are released from jail) 		

	3.2 Mike's Update	 The Province did not assign authority to law enforcement. Law enforcement can respond to covid related complaints, however they have not been given the authority to enforce regulations. The welding shop was able to create 3 separate areas for classroom/shop space to accommodate 26 students separated into 3 groups which meets the 10 students per classroom policy with access to separate entry and exit points. A fogging machine has been ordered and is expected to arrive soon. The cleaners will be trained on how to use the machine. A schedule will be determined on how often the machine should be used. Accommodations have been made for students who have to wait for the bus. They no longer have to wait outside, and can now wait inside in the main foyer entrance area. Devices have been installed on the doors to prohibit entrance access to this area. Mike wants to initiate a "secret shopper" type of set-up to closely monitor the screening process, specifically to monitor that the mandatory questions are being asked as staff/students enter the building.

	3.1 City of Thunder Bay Emergency Task Force Update	 Thunder Bay Regional Hospital is at 98% capacity with 3 covid patients. 21 – 22 cases will be announced today with 9 coming from the jail. This may have come from blanket testing. Currently there is an outbreak with the homeless population. Looking at testing ideas for vulnerable population. Vaccinations continue to take place in long-term care facilities. Looking for direction from the government on congregate settings such as apartment complexes, EMS, First Nations. Thunder Bay will be going in to the Red Level on February 16th. Weekly monitoring continues. Can change depending on numbers. Some long-term care covid tests came back as false positive. Unsure of what happened here. Vaccination seems to be effective. With the vulnerable population, hotel use has doubled. There were 59 vulnerable people in hotels this week. Funding for vulnerable/homeless population expires March 31. Announcement to be made as to if the funding will continue. There are some security issues with the vulnerable population. 		

4.0	3.2 Mike's Update Other Updates	 Warming centre at the Thunder Bay campus has been put to good use by our students who use city bus services. Fogging machine has arrived. Mike has a meeting with the cleaning supervisor to set up a weekly fogging schedule. 	
	4.1	 L. Christie shared covid numbers in the West. 12 active cases in Kenora with 4 at the local hospital. 1 active case in Rainy River. 1 active case in Sioux Lookout. For a total of 14 in the District. The Kenora Campus is experiencing challenges with part-time faculty who teach in the Nursing and Paramedic Program but work full-time in the industry. They're coming into contact with covid patients which prevents them from entering the campus to teach labs. Lab classes then have to be postponed to a later date. Students in the Paramedic program have raised concern that when it comes time for them to do ride outs, how will their classes be affected if they come into contact with covid patients during transport.

	3.1 City of Thunder Bay Emergency Task Force Update	 Thunder Bay will be staying in lockdown due to increased numbers of Covid cases The decision on Stay at Home Order is not made by the TBDHU Janet DeMille shared that the Ministry will provide assistance to Thunder Bay Approx. 4000 vaccinations a week in the district. A database is being constructed to track how many people have been vaccinated and if they have received their first, second or both doses Thunder Bay Jail outbreak will soon be declared over and the Section 22 Order will be rescinded TBDHU will release messaging with regards to isolation shelters in the coming week FWFN has declared a State of Emergency as there is a spike in cases 17 cases over the weekend – still waiting on the results of another 70 tests DSSAB will receive \$2.4 million dollars in funding to help with Covid expenses
