Explain

Emphasize—They Add Force

Qualify— They Limit or Restrict

however, yet, besides, still

Illustrate

for example, for instance, next, such, thus

Add Information

in addition, as well, as well as, furthermore, also, moreover, so, then, another, besides, first, second, third

Things Are the Same—They Compare

in the same way, equally important, similarly, too

Things Are Different—They Contrast

on the other hand, in contrast, for all that, on the contrary, whereas,

instead

Concede Something—They Say It Is True
